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This term we will be learning about our School's Local Area, we will explore the use of maps and construct a key. Literacy

Key Texts: Avacado baby, Elmer, The Elephant and the Bad boy, Silly Billy, Mixed and Ruby's Worry.

Purpose for writing: Defeat the monster and a journey story.

Writing: Children will be learning the story 'The Three Little Pigs' through talk for writing. We will draw a story map and learn to retell the text. Our focus this term is on simple sentence structure.

Shared reading: We will be focusing on how to take care of books and how we handle books this term. We will then be learning how to make simple predictions based on a text and learn the meaning of new vocabulary.

Phonics: We will be revisiting Phase 3 and Phase 4 phonics using Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised.



Geography

In Geography we will be looking at our School's local area. We will be learning about physical and human features of the local environment. The children we learn how to draw a map, and construct maps and keys.

Focus: 'Getting Started' Login, navigate and mouse skills.

PE

Focus: Games

"Fundamental skills"

Control, co-ordination, move safely, take turns, throwing, rolling, catching and aiming.

Music

Maths

Key Facts: Count to 20 and know 1 more/1 less of a given number. Doubles and halves to 10

Number: In Maths the focus for the first half-term will be on Number and Place value within 10. This includes reading and writing numbers, ordering numbers, saying which is greater than and less than, and counting forwards and backwards.

Addition and Subtraction within 10: The children will be focusing on adding and taking away within 10 using resources and instant recall of number bonds within 10.

Science

Focus: Physics and Chemistry—Everyday Materials

The children will be learning to name and identify everyday materials to include wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, rock, brick, paper, fabric, elastic, foil, card/cardboard, rubber, wool, clay.
