PE Days:

Thursday & Friday

Reading at home:

We expect all of the children to read for 10 minutes every day at home. Please write a comment or date and sign their reading diary to let us know that they have read. Your child will be given a reading book on a Monday for the week. They must remember to bring it to school every day. We will collect all books in on a Friday morning and will issue a new book every Monday.

Phonics

In June the children will all be taking a Phonics Screening Check. This check is a pass or fail, and checks their Phonic ability to decode and blend to read words. Please continue to practice your child's phonics at home, using the assessment sheet that was sent home, and will be updated regularly throughout the terms.

Homework

This term we will be focusing on children reading at home as much as possible. The expectation is that the children read their books every evening. They will continue having weekly Maths homework on a Friday. They will also be bringing home a copy of our Talk for Writing story map so they can continue to practice our new text at home.

Reminders & Considerations

Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing for the school day. They should come to school each day with a waterproof coat. In Year 1 we have our own outdoor area, therefore the children will be outdoors in all weathers.



Literacy

Key Texts: The Flamingo Hotel.

Purpose for writing: Postcard—Recount

Writing: Children will be learning how to write a postcard using the model text: Paddington's postcard from London.



Shared reading: We will then be learning how to make simple predictions based on a text and learn the meaning of new vocabulary using the book: Meerkat Mail

Phonics: This term we will continue teaching Phase 5 phonics, the children will be learning new sounds. Please continue to practice the old and new phonics sounds that the children will be learning, in preparation for the Phonics Screening Check.

Geography

Focus: UK Countries

The children will learn all about the UK and the four countries, England, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales and their capital cities. We will be spending time learning about where the countries are located on a map, and learning about their key characteristics.

Design and Technology Focus: Structures

We will be making a London Monument to fit with our topic of Paddington Meets Royalty. The children will be working with paper and card to make simple flaps and hinges. They will learn the skills of shaping and joining using simple equipment.

PSHE & Relationships education Focus: Rights and Responsibilities

Children will learn how to take care of things including: Myself, my money and my environment.

Maths

Key Facts: Count to 20 and know 1 more/1 less of a given number. Doubles and halves to 10. Number bonds to 10.

Number: In Maths we will be learning place value to 50, the children will count forwards and backwards within 50, represent numbers within 50 using tens and ones and compare groups of objects and numbers within 50.

Measurement: We will be learning about weight and volume, the children will use key vocabulary and use practical resources to measure and compare weight and volume.

Length and Height: We will be learning how to measure the length and height of objects using a ruler, and objects.

Science

Focus: Biology—Plants, flowers and seasonal change

The children will be able to identify and name a variety of common and wild garden plants.
